



# Reproductive Psychiatry Fellowships in Maternal / Perinatal Mental Health November 2022

This document provides a catalogue of psychiatry fellowship programs that focus on Women's Mental Health and/or Reproductive Psychiatry. These fellowship programs are available to trainees who have completed or will soon complete their psychiatry residency and are primarily offered at hospitals and universities.

This list focuses exclusively on freestanding women's mental health fellowships, and does not include another important type of post-residency training, women's mental health tracks within Consult-Liaison fellowships. Consult-Liaison is an officially recognized subspecialty of psychiatry; these fellowships are therefore accredited (and therefore partially funded) by the ACGME, and fellows can sit for subspecialty board certification. Fellows may focus some of their time on women's mental health but also receive broad training in psychiatry as applied to other medical specialties. Freestanding fellowships, by contrast, focus exclusively on women's mental health/reproductive psychiatry. As this is not an official subspecialty, these are not accredited ACGME fellowships. They are funded largely through philanthropy or through clinical billing on the part of the fellow. There is no subspecialty certification process, so content may vary across fellowships. We have chosen to focus this initial list solely on the freestanding fellowships, and will plan to publish a separate list of Consult-Liaison fellowships that have women's mental health tracks in the future.

This information was gathered by starting with a 2016 listing of fellowship programs created by Sarah Nagle-Yang. Information about each program was emailed to the program point of contact (typically the program director and/or program coordinator) with a request to update the information. Most programs provided updates and we plan to continue updating this document.

## Summary of fellowship programs:

- 16 fellowship programs are included (15 in the United States and 1 in Canada).
- The majority of programs accommodate one fellow. Six programs can accommodate two or more fellows.
- Most programs accept MD/DO postgraduates, but one program (Case Western) also accepts nurse practitioners
- Most programs are 1 year in length with some 2-year programs or programs with optional extensions.
- All programs except The Motherhood Center in New York City are based in hospitals or academic settings.
- The oldest program was launched in 2002 (University of Illinois). Half the programs have been established in the last five years, with two programs added in 2020 (The Motherhood Center, University of Washington).
- Programs are spread across the country, with groupings in metropolitan New York City (4), Chicago (3), and Boston (2). Notably there are no formal fellowship programs in California, which accounts for over 10% of births in the United States each year.

The fellow will develop an academic project related to perinatal mood disorders and is encouraged to submit a paper for publication and/or present at a conference. Applicants must have satisfactorily completed an ACGME-accredited general psychiatry residency prior to entering the program.
